Incoming animals may maintain residency at HHHS well beyond our reported year and so will not be the basis for determining statistical significance.

## 2020 Euthanasia Reasons

Animals are assessed by 4 different management team members over several days, performing multiple standardized and approved testing methods to determine demeanor results before a decision is caringly and collaboratively agreed upon.

**HHHS Policy does not allow one person to make the decision to euthanize an animal.**
