WORLD SPAY DAY

On Tuesday, February 22nd Mayor Michael A Padilla signed a proclamation naming February 2022 as Spay and Neuter Awareness month in Topeka, Kansas. HHHS' Grace Clinton and Emi Griess were invited by Mayor Padilla to celebrate the creation of Spay and Neuter Awareness month 2022. World Spay Day was created in 1995 by the Doris Day Animal Foundation (DDAF), and 27 years later, the issue of spaying and neutering is still paramount in animal welfare. Adoptable dogs, cats, and rabbits are spayed or neutered at HHHS before joining loving families, yet we still take in a very challenging amount of accidental and unwanted litters of puppies and kittens. Just in the last 6 months (8/22/21-2/22/22), we have taken in 544 kittens under 4 months old and 244 puppies under 4 months old, meaning there is more work to do in our community to promote spay and neuter. We are very hopeful that opening our Spay & Neuter Clinic will have a huge positive impact for those who experience barriers to getting their pets spayed and neutered.
