WHAT TO EXPECT AT GROUP?

The group is free and confidential. There are no membership fees, no personal details collected, and your stories will not be shared outside of group unless you give permission.

- The group always starts and ends with a moment of silence for pets gone by.
- We aim to keep the group around 1 hour so you know what time length you can plan for.
- It's okay to come late or leave early if needed.
- We take turns sharing our stories, experiences, memories, memorials, ideas.
- We don't judge one another for the reasons for a pet's loss, nor do we assign blame to each other or anyone else.
- All newcomers receive a welcome journal provided by Tender Loving Care Pet Nursing Hotel at their first meeting.
- The group is family friendly and all ages are welcome - since pets are part of the family, we know the grief affects everyone in the home in its own unique way.

WHERE TO MEET

The HHHS Pet Loss Support Group means once a month on the **FIRST TUESDAY** of every month at **5pm - 6pm.**

It's in the HHHS Hill's Room - you can come in the main entrance and staff will direct you, OR it's the double doors behind the statue.



There is usually a free-roaming cat named Milo in the group. He's not available for adoption, so there is no pressure. He is owned by HHHS and serves as an ambassador for those needing animal interaction. We've previously voted as a group to have him attend.



Milo came to us with two broken legs and we learned that he excels at providing comfort. We've seen him get into kennels with animals after surgery, we've seen him attend school groups with children, and he usually is happy to sit in the lap of whoever needs a friend.

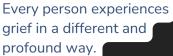
